\*Students that are not fully vaccinated need a negative PCR test certificate, tested within 72 hours.\*

### VISA WAIVER

Available automatically for stays of up to 3 or 6 months for students of most EU countries, the US, Australia, etc

### WORKING HOLIDAY VISA

A 1-year visa that allows you to work and study.

### TOURIST VISA

Available for students from countries without visa waivers, usually up to 3 months.

## VISA WAIVER

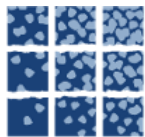
Most Lexis Japan students use a **visa waiver** to come to Japan. No action is required before coming to Japan, your visa waiver is automatic. You will receive a 90 days landing permission when you arrive in Japan.

In general, the longest you can stay without a special visa is 6 months. You can go to the Immigration Office to renew your landing permission at least a week before it expires. If the period of stay is 90 days or less, you can leave Japan once then come back to receive a new visa waiver. South Korea is less than 2 hours flight away and Lexis has two campuses in the most popular cities.

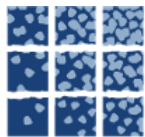

## WORKING HOLIDAY VISA

The working holiday visa is a one-year visa designed to give young people the chance to experience life in Japan. You will have the right to work almost any job, as long as the job itself is not seen as the main purpose of their stay. The visa is only open to people up to 30 years old (or 35 in some countries).

## TOURIST VISA

Students from other countries can apply for a tourist visa from the Japanese Embassy in your home country. Lexis Japan can provide visa documents after receiving full payment of tuition and accommodation fees.

In general, it is not possible to receive a tourist visa for periods of longer than 3 months. This process may take some time, we strongly recommend that you start your application as soon as possible.
